

RULES AND REGULATIONS
16th ANNUAL ASHP CLINICAL SKILLS COMPETITION
FINAL ROUND: SUNDAY, DECEMBER 4, 2011

Congratulations on advancing to the final round of the competition!

- Please wear professional dress. Your team may wear your lab coats if you choose. There will be a photo session prior to your presentation.
- You have fifteen minutes to review the contents of your envelope which includes the forms and papers which were collected from the semi-final round. You may take these into the final round with you.
- There will be no references to consult.
- Each team has a maximum of two minutes to present their case to a panel of judges, and a maximum of eight minutes for the question and answer period. The two minute presentation should include:
 - 1) Identification of student team members and school/college name,
 - 2) Presentation of a brief patient summary with a list of all health problems that require immediate attention; and
 - 3) Presentation of recommendations for goals/treatment/monitoring of the most urgent problem only.

- Either or both team members may present the case and answer questions. Assume the audience is the clinical team rounding with you and you are in charge of the patient.
- If you take questions during the presentation period, you have forfeited the remaining presentation time.
- There will be no questions taken from the audience. Questions are from the judges only.
- Once you have given your presentation, you are welcome to sit in the audience and hear other presentations.
- No finalists will be allowed into the room until after they have presented.
- The judges, case writers and competition coordinators will hold a debriefing session for all interested CSC participants. This will include a review of the answer key and Q&A at the conclusion of the finalist presentations at 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, December 4th, in the competition room (Room 256, Level 2, Convention Center). This session is designed to help you understand what the judges were looking for in the written and oral presentation portions of the competition.
- You are required to attend the Awards Ceremony and Student Society Showcase from 5:30-7:00 p.m. on Sunday, December 4th in Ballroom C, Level 2, Convention Center where the winners of the competition will be announced. All Top 10 Finalist teams will be called to the stage to receive their iPod Touch devices.
