

RESIDENCY ACCREDITATION FEE SCHEDULE

Please note that annual accreditation fees are assessed from the date of ASHP's receipt of the application for accreditation. ASHP's billing is based on the calendar year. Thus, for example, a site whose application is received in April will be billed for three-fourths of the year, or if in June the site will be billed for one-half of the annual assessment rate. The only other assessed fee is the application fee, invoiced upon submission of the application (on-site survey expenses are included in the annual assessment -- there are no additional fees during the year of a program's on-site survey). **Note: The Annual Assessment Fee and Application Fee are subject to change yearly.**

Programs Applying for Pre-Candidate Status are not subject to or included in the above graduated fee schedule. That is, each program in pre-candidate status will be invoiced the initial application fee and an annual accreditation fee -- for 2011 the application fee is \$820 and the annual fee is \$1510; for 2012 the application fee is \$875 and the annual fee is \$2000.

Multiple-site Programs: when there are multiple residents in a program and they are home-based in separate sites, or if a residency is conducted at multiple sites (sites where residents spend greater than 25% of the program time), the other site(s) will be assessed one-half of the annual fee for one program -- in addition to the base fee above.

In instances where multiple site residencies that fall under the auspices of one corporate entity are spread across a wide geographical area, multiple site “groupings” will be limited to those programs that can be realistically reviewed during one typical two-day survey visit. Hence, programs that are managed by one corporate entity but are separated by distances requiring independent site surveys are considered to be separate residency programs and are charged separately.
