#### 5. Represent Your Student Peers— Nationally

The ASHP Pharmacy Student Forum is led by an executive committee of five student members appointed by the ASHP President-Elect. The committee advises ASHP on student issues. This leadership position requires travel to the ASHP Summer Meeting and Midyear Clinical Meeting. Submit your application for a position on the Pharmacy Student Forum Executive Committee. Don't worry there is still time—applications are due by November 15. Visit [www.ashp.org/students](http://www.ashp.org/students) for application information.

#### 6. Influence ASHP Policy

Many of the ASHP policy-recommending bodies, known as Councils and Commissions, reserve one position on each for a student representative. If you are interested in shaping the future of health-system pharmacy practice, submit an application for a position on an ASHP Council or Commission. Applications are due by November 15, so get started on yours today! Visit [www.ashp.org/students](http://www.ashp.org/students) for application information.

## 7. Advise ASHP on Issues of Interest to You

Submit an application indicating your interest in an appointment on a Pharmacy Student Forum Advisory Group. These groups advise ASHP on student relevant issues such as Education & Programming, Leadership Development, Policy & Legislative Advocacy, Student Society Development, and Communications. Advisory group members are appointed by the Chair of the Pharmacy Student Forum. Applications are due by May 1st. Visit [www.ashp.org/students](http://www.ashp.org/students) for details.

## 8. Earn \$2500 and a Drug Reference Library

How you ask? Submit your application for a Student Leadership Award! Each year ASHP awards up to 12 students who have demonstrated leadership ability and an interest in health-system pharmacy practice.
