- The new standard goes into effect January 1, 2007.

Obligations of the Program to the Resident	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ 12-month program ▪ Acceptance letter & conditions ▪ Policy on leave ▪ Support for resident, space, financial, etc. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Duty Hrs guidance ▪ Must adhere to the Rules of the Resident Matching Program
III. Obligations of the Resident to the Program	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Residency is the primary commitment 	
IV. Requirements for Design & Conduct of the Residency Program	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ 12 sections plus several pages of interpretation 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Divided into 4 sections: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Design -Delivery -Evaluation& Improvement -Tracking Residents ▪ Program Design <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 6 required educational outcomes (includes goals and objectives) - Not greater than 1/3 with patient populations with same disease states - Site may have more than one program that correspond to various settings (ambulatory, pediatrics, geriatrics)

<p>VI. Min requirements of the site conducting the Residency</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Must be accredited by an outside agency ▪ Seek excellence in patient care ▪ Must have sufficient patient base 	
<p>VII. Qualifications of the Pharmacy</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Chief pharmacist & leadership provided ▪ Comply with state, federal & local laws ▪ Safe & Effective Drug distribution system ▪ Patient Care Services ▪ Continuously improving medication-use process ▪ Facilities, personnel and resources
