Michael W. Kelly, Pharm.D., M.S.



Dr. Kelly is Associate Dean for Academic Affairs at the University of Iowa College of Pharmacy. He received his B.S. from the University of Iowa and worked for 12 years as a hospital pharmacist. He returned to Iowa to earn his Pharm.D. and M.S. degrees and complete a psychiatric pharmacy fellowship.
