Dr. Grabenstein was a part of the very first EUA involving the anthrax vaccine in 2005, and has been closely monitoring the trials of SARS-CoV-2 vaccine candidates throughout 2020. We will discuss what a likely EUA would mean and what information is still needed for licensure, the makeup of the approaching vaccines, the distribution campaign, and standards for mass-immunization programs. The webinar will help you make informed decisions for yourself, your patients, your teammates, and your organization as rollout of these novel vaccines begins.
