Target Audience

This activity was planned to meet the educational needs of pharmacists managing solid organ transplant recipients with positive donor cultures, multi-drug resistant organisms, and recipients with existing pre-transplant infections.

Activity Overview

Multi-drug resistant organisms are a problem that continue to grow both in the general population and in the solid organ transplant (SOT) population. It is important to think of antimicrobial stewardship considerations when managing SOT recipients to reduce the risk of development of MDR infections. This includes stewardship both pre- and post-transplant. It is important to understand the downstream effects of using broad spectrum antibiotics pre-transplant and how it can translate to MDROs post-transplant. It is also important to be aware of how to respond to a positive donor culture, whether treatment is indicated or not, as well as how long to treat infections in transplant recipients and manage SOT patients with existing infections pre-transplant. Lastly, there has been several new antibiotics that have come to the market and it is important to understand their role in clinical practice.

- Identify various drug-drug interactions between anti-infectives and immunosuppressants.
