I do think some of the topics (depending where the resident is in their year, and what their targeted role is as after residency) could be adjusted to meet the needs of the specific resident (maybe have a running list of topics - ones that are required, and ones that could be substituted out).

10. What suggestions can you make to improve this learning experience?

The mini-dose presentation in central is somewhat distracting. We are fortunate to have a very nice, accommodating conference room that could be used to deliver this presentation without it being so awkward. Also, given the low stakes of the mini dose, I'm not sure sending the drafts to three people for three different sets of edits is warranted. I would recommend maybe only having one person provide edits as all of my preceptors are highly qualified to provide feedback on an individual basis.
