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****Description****

Preceptor development is seldom covered in pharmacy education. This book seeks to provide helpful tips for those who are looking to precept or are looking to improve their current teaching skill set.

****Purpose****

The effective training of future pharmacists is becoming more critical due to the expanding role of pharmacy services. The purpose of this book is to detail how to effectively precept both pharmacy students and residents.

****Audience****

Although all preceptors would benefit from this book, those who are new to precepting students and residents will find it most useful.

****Features****

Organized chapters cover an array of topics, from how to write a syllabus/learning experience to how to deal with difficult situations to preceptor assessment and development. Each chapter contains real-world cases demonstrating concepts in action. Additionally, case questions are supplied to promote critical thinking. Quick tips throughout the chapters and summary boxes toward the end of the chapters highlight key concepts.
